


## You will need:

- A cereal packet
- Paint, paintbrush, pot
- Marker Pen
- Glue
- Scissors
- Messy apron
- Optional colouring pencils
- Small plate

## Make Your Own Rocking Whale





Ask an adult to help you with the scissors and cutting out.


Carefully cut out the back of your cereal box.

Using the back of the cereal box, draw around the plate to make a circle and cut it out.

Fold the circle in half.

Mark the half circle as shown and cut out.





Be careful not to cut too much of the fold and save all the pieces!


Activity Sheet – Rocking Whale



Cut a small curve out of the extra rounded piece to make the tail fluke.


Paint the main whale body and the tail fluke piece. You may want to do in two colours as shown.

Set aside to dry.











When the whale is dry, draw a big smiley face and a friendly eye.

Carefully fold the very tail end of the body slightly.


Glue the tail fluke piece together and glue onto the folded section of the tail.

Cut a small hole in the top of the body and add the water spray.

Give your whale a tap to make it rock!

Now all that's left to do is to give your rocking whale a name!

Perhaps write a story about it or draw a picture.
