

Make Your Own Eggbox and Toilet Roll Snorkel

You will need:

- An eggbox
- Two toilet roll inners
- Paint, paintbrush, pot
- Stapler
- String or wool
- Scissors
- Messy apron



Ask an adult to help you with scissors and cutting out

Cut your eggbox in half and save the bobby bit for another project such as an eggbox whale.



Carefully cut the bottom of the lid out.

You might find it easier to cut through the middle first.

Be careful not to damage the sides (but don't worry if you do – it can be fixed with a stapler.)



Crease the bottom of your eggbox lid slightly to make the bridge of the nose.

Crease one end of one of the toilet rolls slightly and carefully fit it inside of the other one to make a long tube.

You are now ready to paint.





Paint your lid section and your toilet roll section any colour or colours you like and leave them to dry.

When they are dry, carefully poke a hole in either side of your lid section.

Ask a grown-up to help.



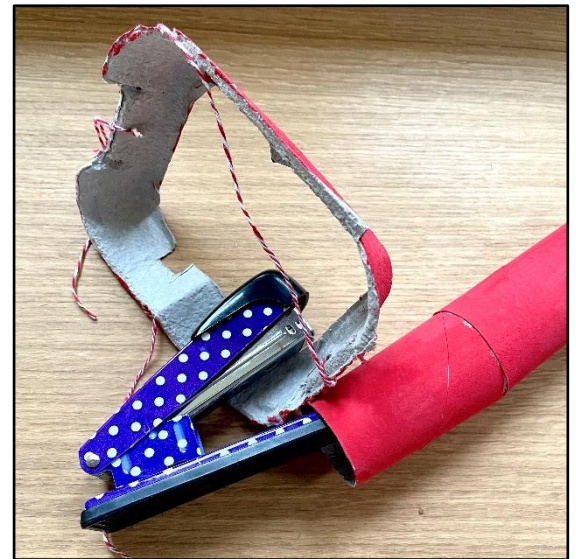
Cut two pieces of string or wool and thread one through each hole and fasten them on.

You can tie them around your head once you have finished to hold the mask in place.



Finally, staple your toilet roll tube to the side of the lid – it's a bit fiddly so please ask for some help if you need to.

Re-bend the nose section up, and you are finished. Time to 'Go Diving' !



If you have enjoyed making your mask and snorkel, perhaps have a go at making some of the eggbox sea creatures using the other section of your eggbox that you saved.
